**Bloustein School Graduate Students Present Orange Complete Streets Findings Wednesday, January 28th at 7:30 PM in Orange City Hall (29 North Main Street)**

ORANGE, NJ – On Wednesday evening, January 28th at 7:30 PM, graduate students from the Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy (Rutgers, New Brunswick) will be presenting their “Orange Complete Streets” findings after a fall semester of study. The instructor for the Complete Streets Studio is Charles T. Brown. Mr. Brown has arranged for an encore presentation of the report. It will be presented by graduate students Aileen Daney, Jordan Kocak, James Bonanno and Jennifer Buison. Findings were originally presented in December. The presentation will be held as part of the regularly scheduled Orange Planning Board meeting. The meeting will be held on the 4th floor of Orange City Hall, located at 29 North Day Street. Doors will be open at 7 PM. The presentation is expected to take one hour. The public is invited and encouraged to attend.

The presentation and report will outline a “Complete Streets Concept Plan” for the City of Orange Township. The plan is intended to improve walking and cycling access in Orange and is meant to make the township’s streets safer, more pleasant, and more accessible for all people. Orange has already formally adopted a Complete Streets ordinance. The report is intended to serve as a guide for future Orange improvements. All recommendations are based on findings from the audit. A Bike Plan has also been presented that, if approved, will replace a Bike Plan originally adopted in 2004.

The “Complete Street” concept is one that has been advocated by coalitions and organizations throughout the country that want to see streets designed for all users, not just for automobiles.
