

# Orange students a hit at concert

Orange High School was well represented last week during the 12th anniversary of the Education Law Center's Kids in Concert performance in Long Branch High School.

Students in the school's Nu Delta Alpha chapter of the National Dance Honor Society, under the direction of Tosha Brown, opened the concert with a celebration of African American dance pieces which supported the concert's theme: "The 20th Century: By Decade."

Voices in Harmony, the school's advanced choir directed by David Milnes, contributed to the decades of the 1950s and 1960s with a stirring rendition of "doo-wop."

OHS student Vanessa Louis was awarded a \$ 1,000 scholarship by the Education Law Center, which is based in Newark. The center's Chantelle Brown announced the award after the opening dance performance.

The school's two arts groups were selected for the annual event based on the quality, creativity and type of performance submitted via a video application to the concert selection committee. It was the ninth consecutive year that the school's dancers have been selected to perform and the third consecutive year for Voices in Harmony.
