

# Scotland to receive cleanup

Orange will join a group of cities which will host volunteers from a national communications company for a beautification project which will be part of a larger citywide program.

During the daylight hours Saturday, residents can join city employees and volunteers from Comcast in a project to clean up and beautify Scotland Road as part of Comcast Cares Day. It is a national program in which employees from Comcast's offices volunteer to assist local residents in community projects.

In other parts of Orange, immunization against illness will be stressed during a walk from Monte Irvin Orange Park to East Orange General Hospital. Residents will meet in the park, at the Central Avenue entrance, at 9:30 a.m. The group will begin its walk along Central Avenue at 10 a.m. Once at the hospital, residents will be entertained by a "battle of the bands," as well as a performance by the senior- resident High Class Theater Group.

At Metcalf Park, the Orange Division of Recreation will begin the youth baseball season at noon with the league's opening-day ceremonies. Players will walk in a parade into the park as part of the ceremonies and fans can enjoy food and refreshments throughout the day.

Participants in the beautification effort may register at Daily Soup, near the intersection of Scotland Road and Central Avenue, at 9 a.m. They will be placed in groups to begin work until approximately 2 p.m., then go to Metcalf Park to be honored for their work and enjoy a light lunch.
