Begin Executive Summary Below:

The City of Orange Township is requesting a surplus appropriation waiver related to the CY 2021 budget in the amount of \$3,700,000. If the City is not granted this waiver, it would result in a significant reduction in workforce, including police and fire which could endanger the safety and welfare of the City's residents.

The City hired 10 police officers and 5 special law enforcement officers – class II in CY 2019 and hired an additional 16 new officers and 4 new special law enforcement officers – class II in CY 2020. These hires were critical to provide adequate public safety and to ensure compliance with the Governor's Executive Order in response to COVID-19. It was also significant to reduce overtime costs.

The City's fire department was significantly understaffed in the prior years. In order to protect the safety of its residents, the City hired 19 firefighters in CY 2019. These hires were necessary to maintain the table of organization as recommended by the director of the fire department.

Furthermore, the collective bargaining agreements which provided a 3% annual wage increase plus steps for both police and fire expired December 31, 2020. The City is now faced again with the collective bargaining process.

The City has restructured and increased staffing in the police department over the last 4 years. During that same period and as a direct result of staffing changes the City is experiencing an aggregate decrease in violent crime of 70%. While not yet at full staffing levels, schedule changes and manpower increases have increased patrol coverage on all shifts and permitted the creation of an intelligence unit and a specialized gang unit. Reduced overtime pre COVID should continue to decrease post COVID.

Fire department staffing remains below NFPA standards but are getting better. We are replacing retirees at a better rate than previously and should get to full operational staffing levels with the next recruit class of 10. As a result of retirements and replacements of lower paid personnel we have a smaller fire contribution to the waiver request. We are still currently 16 below keeping up with appropriate staffing levels but will make up 10 additional spots this year. Fire fatalities have dropped to zero.

The additional tax increase if the waiver is granted is \$496 per average household assessed at \$175,000. However, this has been offset by the utilization of cash surplus. The introduced CY 2021 budget calls for a tax increase of \$290 inclusive of the waiver.
